THE CHURCH MONTH....

From the Book of Common Prayer:-

'Almighty God, Who by Thy Son Jesus Christ did give to Thy holy Apostles many excellent gifts, and did charge them to feed Thy flock: give grace, we beseech Thee, to all bishops, the pastors of Thy Church, that they may diligently preach Thy word, and duly administer the godly discipline thereof; and grant



to the people, that they may obediently follow the same; that all may receive the crown of everlasting glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Election of a new Bishop:-

There are seven Scottish regions, each known as a Diocese, which form the Scottish Episcopal Church. Each Diocese is run by a Diocesan Bishop, who oversees the spiritual and practical concerns of the clergy and lay people within their own diocese. Glasgow & Galloway Diocese moved quickly to replace Bishop Kevin, who retired last August. An Electoral Synod, comprising clergy and Lay Reps met in September to agree the process and to appoint a

Preparatory Committee, to advertise and draw up a short leet of three approved candidates. The process is totally confidential and the only name published is that of the successful candidate, who has to be approved by both clergy and laity. Andrea and Tim went on Jan



11th to join with others to interview the candidates, and returned on Jan 18th for the election. **The Rev Canon Dr Nicholas John Bundock, from Didsbury, is the new Bishopelect. Consecration Service will be on 3rd May at Glasgow Episcopal Cathedral.**

Address on Epiphany 1:-

Baptismal fonts are often hidden away until needed for a Christening, but this time it had been brought out into full view for the address, as the story of the Epiphany was portrayed, with a lovely little drawing of a dove descending with a leaf in it's beak.



The prominance of the Font was striking, and it reminded me of a little font owned by Canon Robert Bisset, which he treasured deeply and it has been in our possession for some time. It is barely 9cm high and 6.5cm across the top, so



it was highly portable for the 'Cycling Cleric'

During wartime ministries in Lanark and the East End of Glasgow, he rode his bike to see members in town and country and it went with him. He may well have used it for a final baptism for ill children, and adults, when many diseases were fatal, with lack of modern medications. He also served as the Padre at an Italian prisoner-of-war camp near Lanark, and he may well have baptised a number of adults then.
