Why the name AUGUST?

I have always been intrigued with the number of Saints' Days we have in the Episcopal Church, which are available for celebration, besides the 'normal' ones we all know and love.....such as the ones Andrea mentions at the beginning of our services.

One place for information is to look in the Website of 'The Scottish Episcopal Church' for lots of interesting facts, for private study, or to help find specific information.

Many days of the the year are covered about saints, and it is a mine of information just waiting to be discovered.

In **August** there are 13 listed, with the day of their celebration, and year of their death. Some of the dates may be nominal, the year of death might be dubious, and life details sparse, but they include Maximilian Kolbe, Priest and Martyr (1940), Claire of Assisi (1253), Abbot Bernard of Clairvaux (1153), Abbess Ebba of Coldingham Priory (683), and Bishop Aidan of Lindisfarne (651).

A Perthshire Church to visit:-

Killin, Perthshire, as a village, is probably known best for The Falls of Dochart over which you travel from the south on the A827. When water is streaming from the hills, the foamy rush is spectacular over the shallow river bed.

The Shutters Coffee shop, on the Main Street, is not to be ignored but the real reason we went there in June 2008 was to sing Evensong at St Fillan's Episc. Church which was served by Rev Ladd Fagerson. I certainly remember the lovely pre-Evensong snacks we enjoyed, courtesy of the local C of S.



It is an example of a 'Tin Tabernacle' (also known as an iron church) with a Grade C listing, and the very distinctive green metal roof. They are described as a prefabricated ecclesiastical building made from corrugated galvanised iron. They were developed within the Uk in the mid-19th century.

Contact details are available on their website, and it is certainly worth a visit.
