A Church to visit in Wittenberg:-

This University town in eastern Germany, was home to Martin Luther, a Catholic priest, who helped shape the Protestant Reformation, by his 95 Theses, posted



on the door of the very-ornate **SchlossKirche**, which we visited on Palm Sunday, earlier this year.

We also saw the **Stadt-Kirke** where Luther preached and celebrated in 1521, a' Protestant' service, not in Latin, but in the local German, and the elements distributed to all those present some truly remarkable changes.
