The FISH BANNER:-

It does not need a lot of deep thought to recognise the significance of the mural facing us above the archway to the sanctuary.

Peter and Andrew were fishermen and later were called to be fishers of men, by Christ. 'Great draughts of fish', 'Jonah and the whale', 'nets and fishing boats' are all part and parcel of the early Christian story.

A joint effort from Liz Farrow, Mark Ulrich (who drew a plan) and the weekend retreat in Sept 2017 involving various ladies of the congregation saw the this lovely, and striking, image put up in June 2018.

When first seen, you note a horde of fishes all swimming as a team; look again, and you notice that one is swimming the other way. Was there an intended allegory, or was it an accident? I was reminded of the childhood hymn about sheep and a shepherd. 'There were ninety-and-nine who safely lay in the shelter of the fold, but one was out on the hills away, far off from the gates of gold......'.

So, the image is constantly before us, of someone swimming in the wrong direction needing some help.

With his great love of fishing, I think Canon Robert Bisset would have certainly approved!
