Calling a new Rector

The Vestry has produced the Church, Priest and Financial Profiles which are required at the first stage of discerning the call of a new Rector to succeed Andrea. They used the views which members of the congregation expressed via the questionnaire which a high proportion of the congregation returned.

Johanna was able to use an AI tool to turn words in the questionnaires into a WordCloud describing the church which is an interesting image which we hope will stimulate conversation with those interested.



The profiles have been sent to the Bishop for his approval and advice. Another church in the Diocese has already advertised for a part-time Rector and interest has been shown.

So the Vestry hopes to be able to meet with interested people, at least informally, in the coming months.

It may be early in 2027 before a new person is in post.

News of Ordination

Stephen Parratt has been recommended to Bishop Nick for ordination. Stephen has provided the following account of the process.

"Following a conversation with Andrea prior to her retiring, in which she invited me to consider exploring ministry within the SEC, I have taken some months to reflect on and pray about this and to begin this exploration. This resulted in an invitation to go before the Panel which advises the Bishop on candidates for ordination. In my case this is a transfer of ordination from the Baptist Union to the SEC. The panel meeting took place at the start of June. The result of the meeting was a recommendation to the Bishop that I be accepted for ordination within the SEC, whereupon an email from the Bishop warmly welcomed me to the SEC.

Plans are now being made for his SEC ordination service in the Autumn. He will continue to be based at St Andrew's and widen his knowledge of the Diocese by attachments eg to Bearsden and Lenzie. He will continue in his main, portfolio ministry of spiritual accompaniment in the Ignatian tradition.

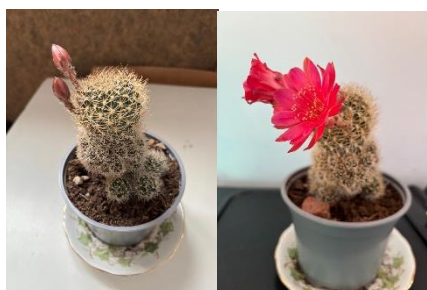
Cacti

From the time I joined St Andrew's a few years ago I was aware of two small, sad-looking cacti on the bookcase in the church hall. Each was just a thin column, about the size of my index finger.



Having some experience of growing cacti (and getting them to flower) I suggested I repot them and give some cactus fertiliser. This I did about two years ago.

I thought they probably needed more light than they had been getting (and less water) so on return they were placed, a bit precariously, on one of the hall window ledges. I added a label to each pot asking that no water be given to them between September and March. (I did occasionally break the rule, applying a meagre dribble of water, given how warm the hall can be.)



Last year they responded with considerable growth, producing 'babies' around and up their enlarging stems.

This year in mid-June flower buds appeared which developed rapidly and some two weeks later the flowers were fully open. Unfortunately, like many cacti, the flowers were short-lived so members of the congregation may not have seen them. At the time of writing there is a suggestion of new buds developing so there may be further flowers.

The two small church cacti have responded well to a bit of TLC - as do most of us! Deirdre
