Confirmation Sunday 22 November 10am

Bishop Nick will be with us to conduct a service which, since the church's revision of its Initiation Rites in 1998, is called "Re-affirmation of Holy Baptism". The revision brought about a significant change in tradition in that it is now possible to make the re-affirmation more than once. We all re-affirm our Baptisms annually and corporately as part of the Easter Liturgy but people who are at a significant stage of faith development may wish to take the opportunity to make it more personal at the forthcoming service.

Our young acolytes [candle bearers] Xander and Patrick are at an appropriate stage of their faith development and will be part of the service. The first time Baptismal vows are re-affirmed at a service conducted by a Bishop continues to be called Confirmation.

Anyone in St Andrew's who wishes to take the opportunity to mark a significant stage of their faith development could also be involved in the service. Please speak to Robin if you would like to know more.
